Form ADV Part 3: Relationship Summary - Laughlin Financial LLC

Introduction

Laughlin Financial LLC ("Laughlin Financial" or "we") is an investment adviser registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. We offer our clients investment advisory services. Clients should understand that the services we provide and fees we charge are different than those of a broker-dealer, and that it is important to understand the difference between the two. What Investment Services and Advice Can You Provide Me?

Description of Services: Laughlin Financial offers investment advisory services to retail investors. Our investment advisory services include: Asset Management Services and Financial Planning and Consulting Services.

<u>Asset Management Services</u>: We provides asset management services which involves us managing and trading your designated account(s). We will discuss your investment goals and design a strategy to try and achieve your investment goals. As a standard part of our services, we will continuously monitor your account when providing asset management services and contact you at least annually to discuss your portfolio. For more information, please see *Item 4* of our *Form ADV Part 2A*. When engaging us for asset management services, you can choose whether you'd like us to provide services on a **discretionary** basis (we will have the authority to determine the type and amount of securities to be bought or sold in your account) or a **non-discretionary basis** (we will have to confirm any trades in your account with you before we place them). <u>Financial Planning & Consulting Services:</u> We also provide financial planning and consulting services. Financial planning services involve us creating a written financial plan for you which covers mutually agreed upon topics. Financial consulting is used when a written financial plan isn't needed. It involves one timeand/or ongoing meetings to discuss your financial situation. Please see **Item 4** of our **Form ADV Part 2A**.

<u>Retirement Plan Services</u>: We offer retirement plan services to retirement plan sponsors and to individual participants in retirement plans.

Limited Investment Offerings: We do not primarily recommend one type of security to clients. Instead, we recommend investment portfolios designed to be suitable for each client relative to that client's specific circumstances and needs. However, we are limited in investment selection in that we can only invest your account in securities which are available on your custodian/broker-dealer's platform. When providing you services, we do not recommend or offer advice on any proprietary products.

Account & Fee Minimums: There are no minimum investment amounts or conditions required for establishing an account managed by us. The minimum fee generally charged for financial planning services provided on an hourly basis is \$400. The minimum fixed fee generally charged for financial planning services on a fixed fee basis is \$800. The minimum hourly fee generally charged for consulting services is \$400. The minimum fixed fee generally charged for consulting services is \$800.

What Fees Will I Pay?

Description of Principal Fees & Costs: Fees charged for our asset management services are charged based on a percentage of assets under management, billed in advance on a quarterly calendar basis, and calculated based on the fair market value of your account as of the last business day of the previous billing period. The annual fee for asset management services will based upon a fee schedule which ranges between 0.40% and 1.00%. Because our fee is based upon the value of your account we have an incentive to recommend that you increase the level of assets in your account. When engaging us for asset management services, you will also incur other fees and expenses. The broker-dealer/custodian on your account will charge you transaction fees for executing trades in your account. You will also be charged internal fees and expenses by the funds we invest in within your account.

Financial planning and consulting services are provided under an hourly fee arrangement. An hourly fee of \$400 per hour is charged by us for financial planning services and an hourly charge of \$400 is charged for consulting services under this arrangement. We also provide financial planning and consulting services under a fixed fee arrangement. The minimum fixed fee is generally \$800, and the maximum fixed fee is generally no more than \$8,000. We will bill our financial planning and consulting fees to you on a quarterly basis. Any unpaid hourly fees are due immediately upon completion and delivery of the financial plan or completion of the consulting services.

Any fees we charge for financial planning and consulting services will not cover the costs associated with implementing any recommendations we may make.

For retirement plan sponsor clients, we will charge a fixed annual fee, an hourly fee or an annual fee that is calculated as a percentage of the value of plan assets. Our fixed will range up to \$8000 and our hourly fee is \$400.

Additional Information: You will pay fees and costs whether you make or lose money on your investments. Fees and costs will reduce any amount of money you make on your investments over time. Please make sure you understand what fees and costs you are paying. What Are Your Legal Obligations to Me When Acting as My Investment Adviser? How Else Does Your Firm Make Money and What Conflicts of Interest Do You Have?

Standard of Conduct: When we act as your investment adviser, we have to act in your best interest and not put our interest ahead of yours. At the same time, the way we make money creates some conflicts with your interests. You should understand and ask us about these conflicts because they can affect the investment advice we provide you. Here are some examples to help you understand what this means.

To the extent we recommend you roll over your account from a current retirement plan to an individual retirement account ("IRA") managed by us and subject to our asset-based investment advisory fees, this is a conflict of interest because we have a financial incentive to recommend that you move your IRA to us even if it is not in your best interest. For more information about this conflict and our procedures to mitigate the conflict, see *Item 4* of our *Form ADV Part 2A*. When we provide asset management services, we will ask that you establish an account with Charles Schwab Adviser Services to maintain custody of your assets and to effect trades for your account. Our recommendation to use Charles Schwab Adviser Services is not based solely on your interest of receiving the best execution possible. We also recommend Charles Schwab Adviser Services because they provide us with research, products and tools that help us manage and further develop our business operations. As a result, we do not have to pay for such benefits, which save us money; however, these arrangements create a conflict of interest. See *Item 12* of our *Form ADV Part 2A* for more information about our arrangements with Charles Schwab Adviser Services. We actively manage our own personal accounts while at the same time managing your accounts and other client accounts. This creates different conflicts of interest for which we have developed procedures to mitigate and control for those conflicts. For more information see *Item 11* of *Form ADV Part 2A*.

How Do Your Financial Professionals Make Money?

Description of Salary/Payment of IARs: We compensate our investment adviser representatives based on the level of assets that the representative brings in to us as well as the financial planning services the investment adviser representatives provides to clients. This creates a conflict of interest as it gives your representative an incentive to recommend you invest more in your account with us due to the potential for increased payments as well there is an incentive to offer additional financial planning services for increased payments.

Do You or Your Financial Professionals Have Legal or Disciplinary History?
